COUNCILMAN CHILLURA RECOGNIZED BY FLC

The Florida League of Cities, Inc. recognized Council Member Frank M. Chillura with a 2020 John Land Years of Service Award for his more than 20 years of dedicated service as an elected municipal official in the City of Temple Terrace. The award program is named in honor of the late John Land, who served as mayor of Apopka for more than 60 years. Mayor Andy Ross presented Councilman Chillura with a commemorative plaque and pin at Tuesday's City Council meeting.

LUNG CANCER AWARENESS MONTH OBSERVED

November is Lung Cancer Awareness Month, which the City officially recognized by proclamation at Tuesday's City Council meeting. Many thanks to staff at Moffitt Cancer Center for highlighting the importance of prevention and awareness. According to the American Lung Association, the rate of new lung cancer cases in Florida is 58 out of 100,000 – lower than the national rate of 58.7. It ranks 21st among all states, placing it in the average tier. Over the last five years, the rate of new cases in Florida improved by 11%.

Nationwide, approximately 125 million used tennis balls wind up in America's landfills every year, but the Parks & Rec Division is giving local players an opportunity to reduce that waste. Staff is proud to announce that Temple Terrace Tennis facilities have joined the Wilson Recycle Balls program.
